- Update on District goals- DIBELS and chronically absent
 - We are on track and exceeded DIBELS. The goal was 84% we are at 86%.
 - Chronically absent- Our current goal status is not met.
 We are at 8%. We were hoping to be at 3%. We are heading the wrong direction. Incentives are given to the grade level with the best attendance.
 - Quality Staffing goal- Training what kids need to know at a certain grade level. What do our kids need to know. (PLC's)
 - Math goal- TTM is helping
- New district goals- DIBELS we would still keep working toward the 90% goal, but we would look at middle of year data.
- Chronically absent- work for 6%
- Quality Staffing Goal- professional development will continue, collaborative data teams, frequent formative checks for understanding, use data to meet individual learning

- Trust lands funding- should be at least what we have this year, probably more, Reading Tutors, TTM, Extra will go to technology
- Voted to move forward with the same again next year
- We will look at programs for K-2.
